All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:
How did people treat others in the past?

English

- Our text focus this half term will be a variety of Mr Men stories by Roger Hargreaves. We will link these texts with our topic of flight and work towards a final written piece about a journey undertaken by a chosen character.
- We will improve our writing through the use of interesting **adjectives** and powerful **adverbs**. We will continue to ensure that our sentences are **punctuated accurately** and contain **adjectives** and **adverbs** for extra description.
- We will extend our sentences by using a range of **subordinating** and **coordinating conjunctions**, such as, **but, or, yet, so, because, when, if** and **then**, which enable us to add extra information to a simple sentence.
- We will also be recapping our grammatical understanding of sentence types, focusing on **commands, statements, exclamations and questions** before developing our ability to write expanded noun phrases.
- **Checking and improving** our work is a continued focus so that the children are able to self-edit.
- Phonics and spelling support will continue to take place on a daily basis with a spelling test **each Friday**.
- Handwriting is a focus as we continue to ensure that letters are always **formed, orientated and placed on the line correctly**.
- We look forward to celebrating World Book Day, which will be a fun way to support us with our developing vocabulary!

The text we will focus on: Mr Men by Roger Hargreaves

The outcome will be: To write own story using up-levelled vocabulary.

Maths

- Will begin this half term by focusing on the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes. The children will learn how to identify and the number of sides and vertices in regular polygons and investigate symmetry in a range of shapes. The children will then move on to sorting 2-D and 3-D shapes by their properties.
- Investigating patterns in sequences of shapes will also feature in our work this term.
- Fractions will be our second topic of this half term. We will begin by reviewing the children's prior knowledge of simple fractions from Year 1, before working on halves, quarters and thirds of shapes, objects and quantities. We will then learn how to find simple equivalent fractions and order fractions using practical resources and tasty activities ☺
- To finish this term, we will begin our unit of work on time. The children will learn how to tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. They will also learn how to compare and sequence intervals of time and learn the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day
- We will continue to consolidate the children's knowledge of the four operations (+, -, x and ÷) during our maths lessons and morning maths tasks.

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Topic	Science	P.E
<p>Focus is: This half term the children will answer the question "How did people treat each other in the past?" which will link to our History studies. We will learn about the life and work of the Wright Brothers, their struggles and eventual success with flying their aircraft and how their achievements affect our lives over 100 years later. We will also learn about transport before the Wright Brothers.</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: During this topic, the children will develop their chronological understanding and their knowledge and understanding of events and people from the past.</p> <p>SITE links: We will be designing and making Mr Men puppets, linking to our Science work on materials. We will use the puppets to create videos about our Mr Men going on their first flights.</p> <p>Applied through: History / English / Maths / Art / PSHE</p>	<p>Focus is: This half term the children will continue their learning about the properties and uses of everyday materials.</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will conduct scientific investigations about a range of materials to support them in deciding which will be the best material to make their puppet out of.</p> <p>Applied through: Discussion / Sorting and classifying information / Scientific investigation</p>	<p>Focus is: Dance</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will be exploring movement based around a theme and moving imaginatively to music. We will look at different styles of dance.</p> <p>Applied through: The children will be listening to music and choreographing their own movement routines.</p>
